Introduction

¹⁶ Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. ¹⁷ When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. ¹⁸ And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age." Devout Christians realize you can't leave people to find Christ on their own. They'll never do it! Devout Christians specifically and intentionally help people to learn and grow in faith. II. Devout Christians Grow In Faith

Devout Christians give attention to building their faith. They are always growing in their knowledge and love for Christ. And they not only do this for themselves, but they also encourage others to grow as well. They are deliberate and intentional in challenging others to grow spiritually.

Devout Christians are mentors in the faith. Average Christians need mentors in the faith. Devout Christians make the gospel come alive as they teach and challenge others to live the Christian life. A solid faith doesn't happen all at once. But little by little, your spiritual life begins to blossom and grow.

Devout Christians listen to the Holy Spirit as he directs them to become better disciples. As spiritual mentors, they reach out and help people find answers to their questions about God. People have questions about prayer, questions about the Bible, questions about life, legitimate questions that need answers.

Devout Christians are not afraid to reach out and engage people in dialog and discussion on any subject or in any area of faith. They know you don't have to have all the answers to help someone else grow in faith. But you must be willing to help them find the answers as they seek God for them.

Devout Christians believe God has answers to all of our questions. We grow in faith when we learn to trust God while we're still searching for some of those answers. Spiritual growth does not happen just because we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We need a process that is intentional and productive. We grow in faith when we reach out and help others grow in their faith.

III. Devout Christians Believe In Discipleship

God calls every believer to share their faith with others, but devout Christians actually do it! But how you show people the way to Christ is crucial. You can't browbeat or guilt-trip a person into a lasting relationship. Lasting relationships are developed over time and require a lot of grace and mercy to survive.

Devout Christians show others the way of Christ through their friendship, generosity, and honesty. They look for and find answers to the questions people have about their faith in Christ.

Devout Christians are easy to talk to and generally friendly people. They are genuine and authentic. They are honest and trustworthy. Devout Christians are not right about everything, nor do they pretend to be. However, they are persistent in their quest to know God and share his love with others. For them, Christian friendship is not just about sharing common interests; it is about helping others connect with their God-created purpose in life. It takes time to convince people that your friendship is genuine, but it is this type of relationship that reveals to others that God is real and that He cares about people.

Devout Christians go out of their way to show people how to experience the generosity of God's love through the redemption and sacrifice of Christ. Devout Christians don't just tell you how to live the Christian life; they show you how to live it. They know that faith is more caught than taught, so they demonstrate by example, their faith in Jesus Christ.

They don't just talk the talk; they walk the walk.

Conclusion

Sadly, many Christians are not engaged in a growing faith and have nothing to offer their friends and family spiritually. Going to church is a duty rather than a joy and delight! The challenge for the church today is to reintroduce people to Jesus; to let Christ become an active part of their life again.

The early believers gave up the temporal for the eternal. They gave up the stress and pressures of worldly success for the peace and joy and fellowship of God. When it comes to faith, you cannot share with others what you have not experienced yourself.

Many people need to be set free again from the bondage of this world. We need Christians to rediscover the power of Pentecost and the difference Holy Spirit leadership can make. The Holy Spirit is here to help you, but he isn't going to make you do the right thing. You still have a choice. You still must choose God

over the world. But when you do, you will find yourself sharing Christ with others through the real-life experiences that you've personally encountered.

Through prayer and study, generosity, and evangelism, we are transformed from a casual or average Christian into a dynamic person of faith. The first Christians had a contagious faith. They lived their faith, and God blessed them, and the church flourished. When was the last time you stepped outside your comfort zone to share the gospel with someone you know really needed God's help?

Reaching out is at the core of every devout Christian's life. Reaching out to others is what confirms our faith and revitalizes our passion and zeal for Christ. It is the heart of our commission and mission for Christ. We are to go into our world and proclaim the good news that God has come to help and rescue them.

So, what can you do about it? How can you get involved? Well, I'm glad you asked that question. One thing you can do is the next time someone tells you about a situation or problem they are facing, tell them you are going to pray for them, and then do it! Let them know you're praying for them by sending them some scripture verses that deal with their kind of situation. Check back with them to confirm God is at work in their life! Try inviting someone to attend church with you. Get them and bring them. Or meet them at church and sit with them. Or take them to lunch following the service.

I challenge you to do just one thing each week for a month and see if it doesn't spark a new enthusiasm in your faith. If each of us would do just one reach out for Jesus a week, think what a tremendous difference it would make.

We can change our world. But that change occurs one person at a time. Christ is counting on us! It is our faith that overcomes the world. In Matthew 26:37, Jesus said the greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all you mind...and then...love your neighbor as yourself." That is our mission! That is our passion! So, why not do something to reach out this week to bring someone closer to Christ?
